Program Will Support Designated Island of Hawaii Nonprofits

MAUNA KEA RESORT, HI (JULY 2018) – Mauna Kea Resort has announced a new and ongoing initiative effective Sunday, July 15, 2018 that will support Island of Hawaii nonprofit organizations.

Each month the signature restaurants at Mauna Kea Beach Hotel and The Westin Hapuna Beach Resort, will donate a portion of the revenue from “Table 65” to a designated nonprofit organization.

Guests may make a reservation at Mauna Kea Beach Hotel's Manta restaurant or The Westin Hapuna Beach Resort's Meridia restaurant and request Table 65, which will be on a first-come, first-served basis at each restaurant. Diners will receive a twenty-percent discount on their total food and beverage. It's a definite win-win.” Leshner added that the number 65 is a nod to the founding of Mauna Kea Resort in 1965.

July's beneficiary will be the American Cancer Society who is also the beneficiary of The Westin Hapuna Beach Resort's grand opening gala on July 14.
